

Reminder - Sprinkler Restrictions Now in Effect

October 2025

A friendly reminder as the weather warms up – you can give your garden a drink — but only on your **rostered watering days**.



Sprinkler Restrictions Are Now in Place

The State Government’s sprinkler restrictions are in effect from **1 September to 31 May** to help conserve WA’s precious water during the warmer months.

During this period:

- You may only use sprinklers or reticulation systems on your **two rostered days** per week.
- Watering is only allowed on those rostered days **once**, either **before 9am or after 6pm** only.
- No sprinkler use is permitted between 9am and 6pm.

Please check your sprinkler and reticulation settings to ensure they comply with the 2-day watering rules.

Fines may apply

- Using sprinklers **outside your rostered days**, or **between 9am and 6pm**, may result in a fine.
- Even if installed by a builder or landscaper, **property owners are responsible** for ensuring reticulation systems are correctly set.

Tip:

Reticulation systems with timers can use more water than your garden actually needs. Checking your **water meter before and after watering** can help you monitor usage and avoid a surprise on your water bill.



How to Find Your Watering Days

Your watering days are based on the **last digit of your house number** (or lot number if no house number exists).

Refer to the roster table below to find your allocated days:

Last digit of your house number	1	2	3	4	5	6	7	8	9	0
Watering: 2 days / week (scheme water users)	Wed Sat	Sun Thu	Mon Fri	Tue Sat	Sun Wed	Mon Thu	Tue Fri	Wed Sat	Sun Thu	Mon Fri

Example:

14 Wildflower Street → Last digit is **4** → Watering days are **Tuesday and Saturday**.
